On HOLY FRIDAY, Orthodox Christians should stop from their daily cares and attend the divine services. Since it is a day of strict fasting (no food or as little as possible) and prayer, we should take the day off, come to the various services, pray and keep watch. Televisions, radios and stereos should be kept turned off and our homes should have a very subdued atmosphere.

Preparing for our Lord's Resurrection

Confession: Every Orthodox Christian should participate in the Sacrament of Confession at least once during Great Lent and preferably prior to Holy Wednesday Unction and Holy Thursday Liturgy. Confessions will be heard before (and at times during) the services from Lazarus Saturday through Holy Thursday, before and between the services on Holy Friday, and by appointment through the week. We will not be hearing confessions after the evening services during Holy Week (unless previously arranged with one of the priests). Orthodox Christians should not approach the chalice at Pascha without participating in a sacramental confession during the Lenten season. *Do not neglect this important sacrament of the Church.*

Fasting: Great Lent and Holy Week are traditional times of fasting in the Orthodox Church. The fast should be more intense during Holy Week and in particular on Holy Friday. Fasting is an important part of our spiritual preparation. Even if you do not fast any other time of the year, make every effort to participate in this time of self denial as you mystically join with our Lord in this important week.

<u>Attending the Services</u>: Try to attend as many of the Holy Week services as possible—even at the expense of taking a day or two of vacation. Holy Week only comes once a year. Our participation is a small thing in consideration of what our Lord has done for us.

Parking Downtown during Holy Week: Please remember, we don't have any parking available downtown on the church side of the parking lot during the day on weekdays. We can often use the visitors' spaces in the Texas Association of Broadcasters Building directly east of the Church (make sure it says VISITOR on the curb). Also, the Capitol Visitor's Center parking garage at 12th and Trinity offers the first 2 hours of parking free. Street meter parking is available on Red River. Evenings: use both of the lots.
